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## House Republicans Could Face Voter Backlash if Immigration Reform Stalls

**Raleigh, N.C.-** New Public Policy Polling surveys in 7 Congressional Districts across the country find that key Republicans could be in trouble if the House doesn't pass immigration reform this year.

The polls show two things:

- Republican and Independent voters want Congress to pass a solution to our country's broken immigration system
- Many are less likely to support Republicans if the House fails to pass immigration reform this summer

Voters in CA-10 (Jeff Denham), CA-21 (David Valadao), CA-31 (Gary Miller), CO-6 (Mike Coffman), MN-2 (John Kline), NV-3 (Joe Heck), and NY-11 (Mike Grimm) all say they would be less likely to vote for their Congressman next year if he opposes immigration reform. Voters in those districts also say they will be inclined to punish the Republican Party more broadly if the House GOP does not allow immigration reform to move forward.

The reason voters would hold it against their officials if immigration reform does not pass is that there's overwhelming support for it in each of these highly competitive districts. Anywhere from 61 to 69% support the proposal the Senate passed last month. There's also a sense of urgency on the issue with 75 to 78% of voters in each district saying they think it's important the US fix its immigration system this year.

"There are going to be major political consequences for House Republicans if immigration reform doesn't pass this year," said Tom Jensen, Director of Public Policy Polling. "Our polling makes it clear that swing district voters will hold it against their Congressmen if this gets blocked."

Here are District by District breakdowns for these polls:

-In CA-10, 44% of voters say they'll be less likely to support Jeff Denham next year if he votes against immigration reform, to only 24% more likely to. 78% in the district think it's important for the US to fix its immigration system this year, and voters support this





specific plan by a 66/28 margin. There's 73/25 support from independents and 51/42 from Republicans.

-In CA-21, 42% of voters say they'll be less likely to support David Valadao next year if he votes against immigration reform, to only 20% more likely to. 78% in the district think it's important for the US to fix its immigration system this year, and voters support this specific plan by a 65/25 margin. There's 61/33 support from Republicans and 54/35 from independents.

-In CA-31, 47% of voters say they'll be less likely to support Gary Miller next year if he votes against immigration reform, to only 25% more likely to. 75% in the district think it's important for the US to fix its immigration system this year, and voters support this specific plan by a 65/28 margin. There's 58/35 support from Republicans and 55/37 from independents.


-In CO-6, 47% of voters say they'll be less likely to support Mike Coffman next year if he votes against immigration reform, to only 25% more likely to. 77% in the district think it's important for the US to fix its immigration system this year, and voters support this specific plan by a 65/27 margin. There's 60/29 support from independents and 56/34 from Republicans.

-In MN-2, 44% of voters say they'll be less likely to support John Kline next year if he votes against immigration reform, to only 19% more likely to. 77% in the district think it's important for the US to fix its immigration system this year, and voters support this specific plan by a 69/24 margin. There's 66/29 support from Republicans and 65/26 from independents.

-In NV-3, 40% of voters say they'll be less likely to support Joe Heck next year if he votes against immigration reform, to only 31% more likely to. 76% in the district think it's important for the US to fix its immigration system this year, and voters support this specific plan by a 61/34 margin. There's 59/38 support from independents and 49/47 from Republicans.

-In NY-11, 43% of voters say they'll be less likely to support Mike Grimm next year if he votes against immigration reform, to only 25% more likely to. 78% in the district think it's important for the US to fix its immigration system this year, and voters support this specific plan by a 66/26 margin. There's 69/27 support from independents and 59/32 from Republicans.

PPP surveyed 837 likely 2014 voters in CA-10, 552 in CA-21, 657 in CA-31, 692 in CO-6, 696 in MN-2, 544 in NV-3, and 543 in NY-11 between July 5<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup>. The margins of error for the surveys are +/-3.4%, +/-4.2%, +/-3.8%, +/-3.7%, +/-3.7%, +/-4.2%, and +/-4.2% respectively. These polls were conducted on behalf of the Alliance for Citizenship.
