McCrory Disapproval Worsens

Raleigh, N.C. – Since last month’s poll, Pat McCrory has slipped in his approval rating and North Carolina voters continue to be unhappy with the General Assembly.

In January, McCrory had a disapproval rating of 19% and one month later, that disapproval now sits at 33%, with 47% approving of his job performance and 20% still not sure. Now that he has been in office for more than one month, voters are able to have a better informed opinion of him.

Looking at the General Assembly, voters are not quite as pleased. When asked about their opinion of Democrats and Republicans in the legislature, 36% of voters have a favorable opinion of Democrats and 33% have a favorable opinion of Republicans. When asked which party they would vote for in the state legislature for an election today, Democrats beat their Republican colleagues by 1 point (45-44). As a whole, the General Assembly is sitting at a 22% approval rating.

Voters also disapprove of the job Republicans are doing in running the state government with 40% approving and 49% disapproving. Specific policies coming from the state government that voters are concerned with are reduction of unemployment benefits, time period of these benefits, cabinet raises, and McCrory’s opinion on higher education.

“Pat McCrory has angered a lot of voters who were willing to give him a chance during his first month in office,” said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. “But he is at least holding strong with Republicans.”

Most North Carolinians now support banning assault weapons (51-41). 54% of voters support Congress passing stricter gun laws while 40% oppose. When asked whether they have a favorable or unfavorable opinion of the National Rifle Association, 45% said they have a favorable opinion while 42% have an unfavorable position. With this being said, 42% of voters would still be less likely to vote for a candidate who was supported by the National Rifle Association.

PPP surveyed 600 North Carolinian voters from February 7th to 10th. The margin of error is +/-4.0%. This poll was not paid for or authorized by any campaign or political organization. PPP surveys are conducted through automated telephone interviews.
