## **Burr's situation remains unchanged**

**Raleigh, N.C.** – The story on Richard Burr's political situation hasn't changed for months: his approval rating is mediocre but he still leads all of his potential Democratic opponents.

40% of North Carolinians like the job Burr is doing representing them in the Senate while 31% disapprove. He gets good marks from 63% of Republicans, 46% of independents, and 22% of Democrats.

Tested against a generic Democratic candidate, Burr leads 44-40. That four point lead is the smallest Burr has held on the generic ballot since July when he was up by two, but his actual share of the vote is just a point lower than it was the last two months. It's gotten closer because Democrats this month expressed a stronger commitment to supporting their party nominee.

Tested against some specific Democrats Burr leads Bob Etheridge 45-35, Elaine Marshall 45-34, Dennis Wicker 45-33, Kevin Foy 44-32, and Kenneth Lewis 45-32. Given the low name recognition of all the Democratic candidates it is no surprise that none of them are very well known.

"Every poll we do on Richard Burr provides more evidence that his fate will be tied up in the national climate," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "His approval numbers are mediocre but he'll still get reelected if it's a Republican year. If things move back in a more Democratic direction he's extremely vulnerable."


PPP will release new numbers on Barack Obama tomorrow.

PPP surveyed 711 North Carolina voters from November  $9^{th}$  to 11th. The survey's margin of error is  $\pm -3.7\%$ . Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
