Voters Support Ban on Non-Recyclable Plastic Bags

Raleigh, N.C. – Public Policy Polling's latest survey finds that 47% of North Carolina voters would support a proposed ban on the use of non-recyclable plastic bags in major retail stores, with a few exceptions.

31% of respondents said they would not support the bill, which is sponsored by state Sen. Josh Stein, D-Raleigh, and 22% are not sure.

PPP also measured voters' support for using money from the federal stimulus package to make low-income households in North Carolina more energy efficient and found that 48% of respondents support this measure while 35% do not.

Democrats were far more likely than Republicans to support either of these proposals. 51% of Democrats said they would support banning non-recyclable plastic bags, and 65% said they support using stimulus money to make homes energy efficient. Republicans were split 39/36 on the proposed plastic bag ban, and only 28% want federal funds allocated to make low-income homes green.

"The environment is something that Democrats typically care about more than Republicans," said Katherine Rumbaugh, PPP Spring Fellow. "But it's likely that Republicans are opposed to all parts of the federal stimulus package, not just the environment- and energy-specific parts of it."

PPP's poll also tested North Carolinians' opinions of stem cell research and found that 54% of voters support it and 30% oppose.

These numbers are also highly differentiated along party lines. At 68/17, Democrats are highly in favor of stem cell research; 51% of Republicans oppose and 33% support it.

PPP surveyed 725 North Carolina voters from March 30th to 31st. The survey's margin of error is +/-3.46%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
