Just 29% say Burr deserves another term

Raleigh, N.C. – Just 29% of North Carolina voters think Richard Burr deserves another term, with 49% saying it's time to give someone else a chance, the newest survey from Public Policy Polling finds. 22% are unsure.

Even among Republican voters just 49% say Burr deserves another term. 34% of independents and 11% for Democrats do. These numbers reflect one aspect of Burr's precarious position that has not gotten a lot of play, which is that even voters in his own party are not that enthused about him, something that could pose a problem in turning out GOP voters with this race at the top of the ticket next year.

Tested against a generic Democratic candidate, Burr trails 41-38. One thing he does have working in his favor is a 39-32 lead with independents, but he's not showing the level of crossover support at this point that he would need to get reelected.

Burr's approval rating is 34%, in the same mid-30s range PPP has found him in for most of the last six months.

"With Burr's numbers much more dire than Elizabeth Dole's at this point two years ago it's a wonder prominent Democrats aren't fighting for the opportunity to run for this seat," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "The current crop of Democratic leaders in the state just isn't as ambitious as in most places."

PPP will release numbers tomorrow looking at how voters in the state view the five folks who have served as Governor since 1972.

PPP surveyed 784 North Carolina voters from June 12th to 14th. The survey's margin of error is +/-3.5%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
