Grier Martin makes strong showing against Dole

Raleigh, N.C. – According to the latest Public Policy Polling (PPP) survey released today, a hypothetical US Senate race between Senator Elizabeth Dole and State Representative Grier Martin could be close. As it stands now, Dole leads Martin, a Wake County state legislator, 43% to 37% among likely general election voters in North Carolina. Dole also led Guilford County State Senator Kay Hagan 43% to 27%.

“To compensate for the extremely low name recognition of state legislators, we added a short description of Martin and Hagan to the survey,” explained Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling.

Martin was described as a “37 year-old two-term legislator” and “veteran of the War in Afghanistan,” while Hagan was a “five-term State Senator” and “chair of the Senate Appropriations Committee.”

“Grier Martin, or his profile, does very well against Senator Dole,” said Debnam. “If he were to enter the race he could be even more competitive than other Democrats we have tested.”

The poll also finds that Senator Dole has a 46% approval rating in North Carolina, while 40 % disapprove of her job performance. President Bush’s approval rating among likely North Carolina voters is the lowest PPP has ever measured at 35%.

PPP surveyed 553 likely general election voters on July 9. The survey has a margin of error of $\pm 4.2\%$. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
