North Carolina divided on Obama

Raleigh, N.C. – More than a year after Barack Obama took North Carolina by less than 1%, voters in the state continue to be extremely divided about him.

47% of North Carolinians approve of the job he's doing as President while an equal 47% disapprove. He gets support from 77% of Democrats, 41% of independents, and just 9% of Republicans. He has good numbers with liberals, moderates, women, African Americans, young people, and residents of the Triangle and metro Charlotte. He has poor reviews from conservatives, men, whites, senior citizens, and people who live in the Triad or mountains.

Respondents this month were also asked to give Obama a letter grade. Reflecting the degree of polarization in public opinion about his administration most voters gave him either the best or worst rating possible- 32% gave him an A while 29% graded him an F. Overall his 'GPA' with North Carolina voters averages out to something between a C and a C+.

Obama's numbers this month actually represent something of an improvement. PPP's surveys from August-October had found Obama with a net negative approval rating.

"North Carolina was divided about Barack Obama last fall and it's divided about him this fall," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "We don't expect to see that change any time soon- we are one of the most politically competitive states in the country and the President's numbers are a strong reflection of that."


PPP will release new numbers on Bev Perdue next week.

PPP surveyed 711 North Carolina voters from November 9th to 11th. The survey's margin of error is +/-3.7%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
