# **Etheridge Polls Closest of Dems to Burr**

**Raleigh, N.C.** – It's become a pretty familiar refrain- Richard Burr still can't get his approval rating out of the 30s but nevertheless leads all of his potential Democratic opponents by a healthy margin at this early stage.

His approval rating for the second month in a row is 38%, with 32% of voters disapproving of him. 66% of Republicans, 34% of independents, and 20% of Democrats give him good marks.

Despite his tepid approval ratings Burr leads six potential Democratic opponents by anywhere from 7 to 16 points. Bob Etheridge polls the closest, trailing 41-34. Elaine Marshall and Dennis Wicker, the other two candidates with statewide experience, are each down 42-31. Further back are Cal Cunningham at 42-30, Kevin Foy at 43-29, and Kenneth Lewis at 43-27.

Burr's approval is still ten points behind Elizabeth Dole's at the same point in the cycle two years ago.

"With Elaine Marshall's entry into the North Carolina Senate race Democrats will now have at least one proven winner to choose from as their candidate next year," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "Burr's standing has improved a little bit as the climate has gotten worse for Democrats nationally but if Barack Obama's approval starts heading back in the right direction this race has the potential to be a toss up."

PPP will release numbers Monday looking at voter perceptions about corruption in Raleigh and Washington DC.

PPP surveyed 600 North Carolina voters from September  $2^{nd}$  to 8th. The survey's margin of error is  $\pm 4.0\%$ . Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
