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## **Dems Favored in Senate race**

**Raleigh, N.C.** – Ohio voters aren't all that enamored with any of their choices for the US Senate but Democrats start with the advantage, the newest survey from Public Policy Polling finds.

A plurality of voters has no opinion about Jennifer Brunner, Lee Fisher, or Rob Portman. Fisher and Brunner's numbers are basically equal. 32% view Fisher favorably while 31% have an unfavorable opinion of him. For Brunner the reviews are completely split, 32% positive and 32% negative. Portman has the worst numbers with 34% of the electorate viewing him unfavorably and just 22% expressing a positive opinion.

Fisher and Brunner also lead Portman by nearly identical margins, 41-32 for the Lieutenant Governor and 40-32 for the Secretary of State. All three candidates are doing about equally well within their own parties but since Ohio has more Democrats than Republicans and Brunner and Fisher both lead with independents, it allows them to start out with an overall solid lead.

"It's unusual to have an open Senate seat where none of the candidates start out particularly popular with the public," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "The practical implication of it is that all three of them have a lot of space to define themselves to the voters over the course of the campaign, which leaves it pretty wide open."


Independents are particularly agnostic about the candidates, with more than half having no opinion about Fisher or Portman and more than 40% undecided in the head to head contests.

PPP surveyed 619 Ohio voters from June 17<sup>th</sup> to 19th. The survey's margin of error is +/-3.9%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
