# Republicans hold small lead for Governor

**Raleigh, N.C.** – The Republican candidates for Governor of Wisconsin both currently hold a small lead over likely Democratic nominee Tom Barrett. Mark Neumann has a 43-38 advantage and Scott Walker's is 42-39.

None of the Gubernatorial candidates are all that well known. Walker is the most prominent, but 43% of voters still have no opinion about him. Among those who do 31% have a favorable view and 27% see him negatively. Barrett and Neumann are each unknown to 49% of the state. Barrett is seen favorably by a 29/22 spread and Neumann is seen negatively 24/27.

In both match ups the Republicans are leading Barrett thanks to a double digit lead with independents. Neumann is up 43-26 and Walker's lead is 41-29.

Although Barrett trails in the race at this point there's little doubt he'll be a much more formidable candidate than Jim Doyle would have been had he chosen to seek reelection. Doyle's approval stands at just 29% with 58% of voters in the state disapproving of him. He still has a respectable 59/27 spread with Democrats, but his 5% approval rating with Republicans is even worse than Barack Obama's and at 22/64 he's not doing a whole lot better with independents.

"The Wisconsin Governor's race is a tossup at this point," said Dean Debnam, President of Public Policy Polling. "The Republicans have small early leads largely because the national political climate is in their favor, but with none of the candidates particularly well known things could change quite a bit in either direction between now and the fall."

Yesterday PPP showed Russ Feingold with a small lead over Tommy Thompson. Tomorrow's release will look at how voters in the state view the 2012 GOP field.

PPP surveyed 700 Wisconsin voters on March 20<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>. The margin of error for the survey is +/-3.7%. Other factors, such as refusal to be interviewed and weighting, may introduce additional error that is more difficult to quantify.
